The Franklin County Library Board of Trustees met on July 12, 2023, at 4:01 PM at the Franklin County Library with the following present: Carl Goodman, Co-chair; Lynn Claxton, Treasurer; David Eldridge, Bari Beth Lowndes, Angie Fuller, Trustees; Tina Stevens, Director; Kate Huddleston, Regional Library Director.

Roll was called and the meeting minutes from May 10, 2023 were approved as presented.

Reports provided from the following:

Treasurer Lynn Claxton reported confidence is high that Maintenance of Effort is met.

Attached as page 4 is the Library Director's Report. She also shared that close to 3,500 meals have been provided to date through the Summer Feeding Program, a partnership with the University of the South, Americorps, and the Department of Agriculture. Summer Reading continues for the adults. Many are signed up and are registering BINGOs. More than 300 children participated in June for All Together Now Summer Reading. 38 read 100 books! Burger King sponsored ice cream, kid's meals, a one bike. The Franklin County Historical Society Annual Picnic is Monday, July 17, at 5:00 PM at the Robinson Farm in Huntland. The Granville Libscomb home (1802-1853) and Cemetery are the topic of the program. A Special Education Community Conversation is slated for August 17 at the library and led by Susan Carr of The Arc of Southeast Tennessee, library partner. A new partner sponsoring a new program, Dr. Jerry Anderson is offering Tai Chi classes on Fridays at 8:30 AM. He held a workshop this week and will continue the program weekly. Hablantes Español is Thurdays at 10:00 AM is well-attended. The BOOKIES are every second Thursday at 2:00 PM. And, Chess Club is still very popular. iPads and production devices were requested on this year's Tech Grant. The tablets will serve as card catalogs and kiosks for learning games and library digital services. Safety is at the top of the list for staff; drills were held at the June Staff Meeting for active shooter/assailants. The library shares with other libraries across Tennessee. Book kits, given to us by another library, were passed on; a little free library donated to us found home at the Millard Oakley Public Library in Livingston. along with two electric typewriters, and two wooden little free libraries; Crocket Memorial Library in Alamo, Tennessee, grabbed some puppet theaters that were donated to us as well. All were appreciative! Speaking of Little Free Libraries, the one out front was freshly painted by long-time Friends of the Library John and Kathy Hein. It was in great need and they came to the rescue!

Attached as pages 5 and 6 is the Regional Library Director's report.

Treasurer and Budget Committee Chair Lynn Claxton reported the Fiscal Year 2024 Budget passed that included salary increases for all staff.



Building and Grounds Committee Chair David Eldridge reported the cameras are fully functional, the lighting has been installed on the porch, and the landscaping fee has increased with the additional care of the new property. The increase was \$30.00 for the new property. A special patron by Winchester Police Department was requested due to increased personal refuse found in the stairwells and the surrounding grounds like hospital discharge clothing, nightwear, meal trash, etc.

Director's Report July 2023

In the spirit of All Together Now, this year's summer reading theme, we shared with other libraries. We gave...

The children's summer reading program has wrapped up with a whopping 325 readers. 38 kids read 100 books!! Two-year-old Abigail won the bicycle sponsored by Burger King. Burger King also provided ice cream and kid's meals as incentives. For example, for 50 books read participants were awarded an ice cream every day for a whole year! We appreciate all the sponsors of this year's summer reading program: Nissan, Burger King, Southern Tennessee Regional Health System, and Bennett's Pharmacy. 48 Storytime goers enjoyed a field trip to the Stand Tall Molly Lou Melon Trail Tale in June. A History Camp and a Science Camp are scheduled in July as well.

The adult summer reading program continues through July. Readers 'bingo' for chances at gift cards up to \$100. Other programming on tap are: two Franklin County teacher professional development days, Tai Chi classes, and Health Talks by Dr. Shelstad. The Board of Education continues to be a great partner; a stipend is awarded to those attending the workshops. The Friends of the Library provide lunch at Walnut Hill Coffee Company. The seats quickly fill when registration opens! Dr. Jerry Anderson is the Tai Chi Master leading participants in an ancient health practice. Dr. Shelstad's health talks continue through August on topics like The 4 A's: Allergies, Asthma, ADHD and Autism, Tackle Fall Sports with a Functional Nervous System and Healthy Posture, Healthy Kids. There is never a dull moment!

We welcome the new MyLibro app and NICHE Academy. The MyLibro app brings all the library's apps together in one place connecting customers and resources with fewer clicks and higher satisfaction. NICHE Academy is a top-notch training database at the ready on many topics like de-escalation, customer service, and more. NICHE is available to library customers, too. Other tutorials cover Ancestry, learning how to use Facebook, and we have the ability to create content exclusive to Franklin County Library.

Inventory and weeding are in progress. The aim is to weed at least 5% per Minimum Standards. Newer materials are filling the shelves, so room must be made. Currently, interlibrary loan services are on hold while courier contract negotiations are underway at the state level. The staff are referring customers to Libby, hoopla, and neighboring libraries including Sewanee. DuPont Library offers the service. Community members may obtain a card for \$10.
